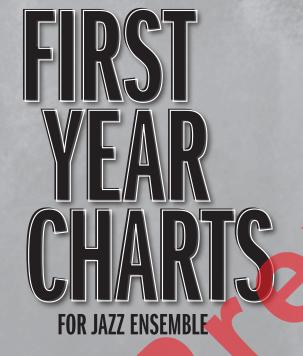

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

"No 'L' in Swing," is based on the popular carol "The First Noel" arranged in a medium jazz waltz style. Note that the marked tempo of 126–132 bmp is only a guide. If your band is more experienced, you may increase the tempo slightly.

The tempo stays the same when the chart changes to 4/4 meter in measure 21. The overall feel concept is that the waltz will have more of a lilt, which means swing the eighths just a little bit and give the 4/4 section a traditional swing eighth feel. A critical rhythm in the waltz section is the eighth rest followed by a dotted quarter note. The trick to make this chart feel like a jazz waltz and not an oompah band is not to let the dotted quarter get played too late; instead, stress that the note be played quickly on the upbeat—almost rushed.

The alto sax solo beginning in measure 38 is completely written out; however, chord symbols are included to encourage some improvisation.

Take care in differentiating between the two accents, especially the rooftop accent (4), which is played detached but not staccato.

I hope you and your ensemble find this chart exciting and worthwhile.
