This timeless theme from the Halloween franchise is one of the creepiest tunes ever written. There should be a general sense of foreboding throughout. Although this arrangement has been written for string orchestra, easy piano and percussion parts are included, both of which are optional.

The long crescendos in measures 13-20 and 33-40 should be very gradual and restrained. Don't build up too much too soon or there will be nowhere to go. The biggest crescendos should occur in measures 20 and 40.
In measures 37-40, the upper divisi notes in the 1st violin are taken in 3rd position. It is totally fine, however, if these measures are played utilizing only the lower notes.
I hope you and your string orchestra enjoy Halloween Theme!
