I began preparing a new score and parts at the behest of Paul Hindmarsh for a CD recording entitled *Vaughan Williams On Brass*, which features a number of original brass band works and arrangements to celebrate RVW 150, the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams. Performed by the Tredegar Town Band conducted by their musical director Ian Porthouse and guest conductor Martyn Brabbins, the CD will be released on the Albion Records label (ALBCD052) in the Autumn of 2022.

The first public performance of this edition was given on Saturday 29 January 2022 by Tredegar Town Band, conducted by Ian Porthouse, at The Royal Northern College of Music, Manchester, as part of the 2022 RNCM Brass Band Festival.

Much of the work carried out on the score and parts was done using the existing published set from 1957, as the intention was to make a definitive recording of the published work. Independently from me Stephen Allen, of Rider University in New Jersey, had also made some observations which I was able to check against my corrected set.

I had been aware for some time that a manuscript of sketches for the **Variations** were 1 end at The British Library and so I went to take a book at these sketches to see if they shed any further light on the work. To my surprise one book of sketches turned out to be a fully notated brass band score. There are some significant differences in scoring between the original manuscript and the final published version; much of it in the voicing but also on occasion the contrapuntal writing is contrary to that in the unal published score. There is very little percussion marked in the manuscript nor tempi reducated for any of the variations.

ances, refer back to the composer's differences between the two were agreed ublication. That id, there are a number of instances where notes, harmonies and rhy hms appear pignificant odds with the original score. It is true that RVW's handwriting was poor and the original manuscript is written in ink, some notation has spread across other space and lines. Regarding the harmonic and rhythmic discrepancies, would have made or allowed significant changes to these, as in some instances they contradict harmonic and rhythmic motifs established across the work, and indeed on oo in the same variation. It is also likely that some rhythmic contradictions I when copying across from the original manuscript and then again when they were subsequently copied in to the final publication. In these instances, the original manuscript takes precedence over the published score.

The corrections do not alter the music significantly, although those with a keen ear will notice some subtle changes.
